MORE VETIVER FACTS



Vetiver grass is highly drought resistant. Vetiver leaves can grow up to 5 feet long, and its roots grow downward 10 feet in depth within two years.

Vetiver is a noninvasive tropical/ subtropical grass native to South Asia and introduced into the Caribbean over 100 years ago. Its unique characteristics make it ideal for land stabilization, soil conservation, and soil erosion control.

Its long, thin leaves and sweet-smelling roots can also be used for handicrafts, ropes, making perfumes, and medicinal purposes.
